Veloo Foundation, established in 2007 in Canada and registered in the USA as 501(c) NGO, has been dedicated to helping orphans and similarly disadvantaged children in the developing world. In addition to supporting education and health projects in various countries such as India and Malaysia, Veloo Foundation has also implemented a number of community-oriented programs in several cities of Mongolia since 2011.

Our biggest project, Children of the Peak Sanctuary Project was established in Mongolia in 2013 and has provided hope to thousands of children. With a focus on education, employment, infrastructure, and community outreach programs, Veloo Foundation is making a positive impact in the community and providing varied opportunities to thousands of Mongolian children in serious need.





## WHY WE DO IT

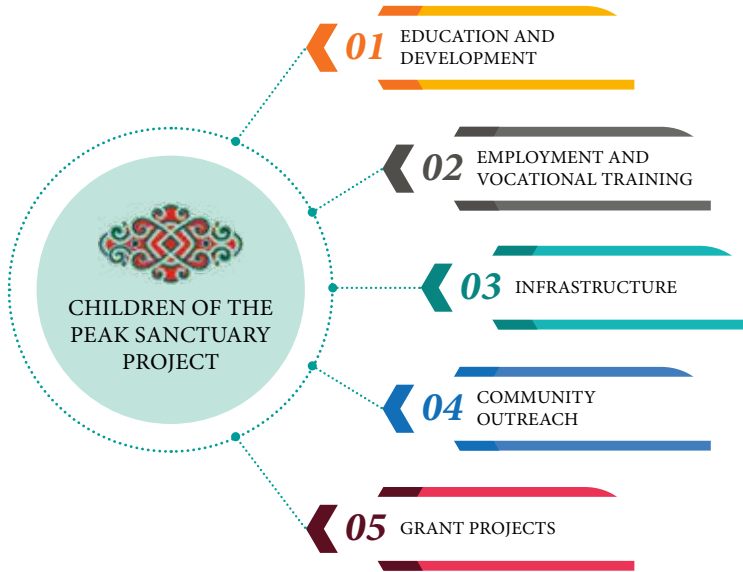
Veloo Foundation's work in Mongolia is driven by the need to provide support to the local community, which is primarily made up of Mongolian nomads who have been displaced from their rural, nomadic lifestyle due to climate change and overgrazing. These individuals arrive in the city with limited resources and without proper registration, making it difficult for them to access social services, healthcare, and education. As a result, many children in the community are left without access to basic necessities and are forced to scavenge for survival.

Veloo Foundation aims to address the root causes of poverty in the community, including the lack of access to education, social services and economic opportunities. By providing access to education and social support to vulnerable children and families, Veloo Foundation believes it will create a future where no one in Ulaanbaatar has to scavenge to survive, and where all children have access to the basic necessities of life.

Our vision is to help disadvantaged children and families in the developing world to experience equal opportunities and alleviate poverty. We believe real opportunities will empower the children and families to be able to help themselves.

While our main focus is on the education of children as they are to become part of the society and to break the cycle of poverty when they grow up, our sub projects are for the support of the parents to let them become an active part in their children's future.

To achieve this goal, Veloo Foundation has developed a range of initiatives that work together in a coordinated manner. These initiatives are designed to complement each other for maximum impact, and fall under the purview of the Children of the Peak Sanctuary Project.

Overall, Veloo Foundation's implementation strategy is centered around a coordinated and comprehensive approach to sustainable development that truly involves the community and local partners in the process.

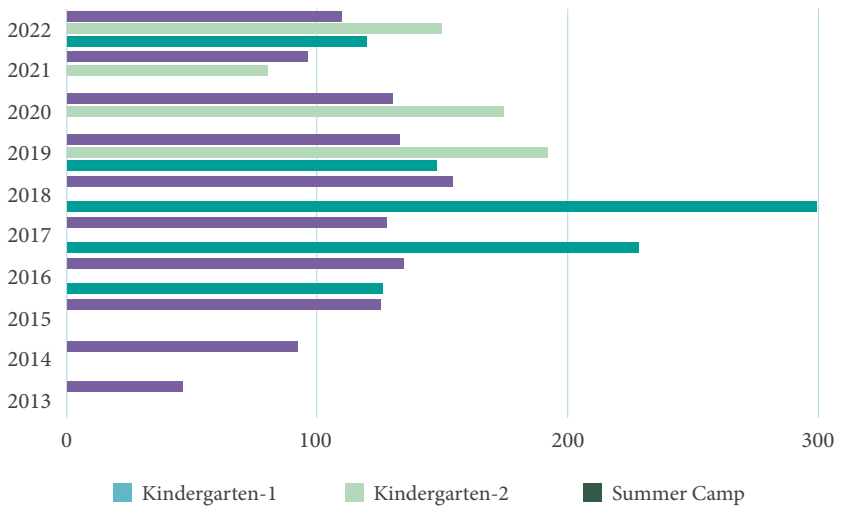

## IMPACT NUMBERS OVER THE YEARS



### CHILDREN OF THE PEAK KINDERGARTEN-1 & 2

The Children of the Peak kindergarten is a remarkable institution where 1st kindergarten was established in the Songino Khaikhan district of Ulaanbaatar in September 2013 and 2nd kindergarten in 2019. Located in the eastern area of the Ulaan Chuluut dumpster, the kindergarten was specifically set up targeting 41st and 26th khoroos to provide free education to vulnerable children in the community. Our target khoroos have over 4000 kindergarten age children while there are only 3 kindergarten with capacity of only 700 children in total.

The founder, Julie Veloo, started the kindergarten as day care center for 40 children on the first day. Her vision was to create a nurturing environment that would provide nutritious food and a safe space for children to learn and play. Today the day care center grew to two kindergartens with the capacity of 250 children.

In 2022, the Children of the Peak Sanctuary 1st and 2nd kindergartens provided preschool education for over 250 children and 110 children entered primary schools successfully graduating from the kindergarten.

In order to provide equal opportunity to the children, in a family environment where the parents are not able to enroll their child to the kindergarten, a distance learning program “Home Learning” was developed and distributed by the kindergarten teachers to a total of 28 children in the community in 2022.

### CHILDREN OF THE PEAK KINDERGARTEN-1 & 2

We distributed necessary school supplies along with school backpacks with the gracious donations from our individual donors and the US Embassy to all the kindergarten graduates who were about to enroll in primary schools.

The government of Mongolia has given its appreciation for the contribution and the work the kindergarten does and awarded it as one of the leading charitable kindergartens of the Songinokhairkhan district in 2022.



In 2022, at the Children of the Peak Sanctuary kindergarten 2, 150 students enrolled and 86 kindergarten graduates entered into primary schools. The 2nd kindergarten continues to provide pre-school education to children from vulnerable families, and it is now under government supervision.

### GANDYS KIDS CAMPUS COMMUNITY LIBRARY



The Gandys Kids Campus Community Library is a collaborative effort between our organization, the Gandys Foundation in England and Rio Tinto Mongolia. Our community is proud to have established this library, which officially opened its doors in September 2021 as the community in much need of such a facility.

The area of 3rd khoroo /mini district/ has 4 schools and 2 of them don't have a library, 3 of the schools have 3 shift classes due to limited school for a big number of students. The library offers a vast collection of over 8,000 English and Mongolian language books, making it a valuable resource for all ages. Additionally, the library has internet access resources for home-based learning and online education, equipped with modern computers and tablets to help facilitate digital learning.

#### PROJECT IMPACT IN NUMBERS

**30-50 Children/day** comes to the library Over **3000 children** benefitted from the library directly with in the last 1 year.

**Over 100** different activities and trainings were organized in the past 1 year

## List of activities and the number of children involved in 2022

Thanks to over 100 selfless volunteers who make time and effort to help facilitate the library to provide the most efficient service to the children in the community.

In celebration of Universal Children's Day, we hosted Pop-Up Festival designed by UNICEF in partnership with European Union Delegation to Mongolia and raised awareness about the importance of emotional health among the community children where more than 50 children actively engaged.



The Library provides access to a wide range of training and clubs which help develop the children in every aspect possible. For instance, by regularly organizing book clubs, children who come to the library are reading at least one fairy tale or a topic per day and according to the librarian, the period of time that a child is spending on a book is increasing each month.

After a year delay of the Covid19 pandemic, on November 2022, we welcomed one of the founders of Gandys International Paul Forkan and Gandys Foundation Director Preet Legha to our library and introduced the amazing work they are doing and place they co-created for the education and development of thousands of unprivileged children here in Mongolia.

## The Soaring Crane Summer Camp

The Soaring Crane Summer Camp is an initiative aimed at providing a meaningful experience for children aged 9-16 from vulnerable families. The camp is designed to offer an immersive Mongolian cultural and traditional education while promoting healthy lifestyles and encouraging personal development.

In 2022, we successfully organized three weeks summer camps, which saw a total of 89 children participating from the Ulaan Chuluut area's most vulnerable children.

The camp also offers a unique opportunity for Dutch volunteer students to engage with the children, exchange cultural knowledge, and foster mutual learning. Overall, the Soaring Crane Summer Camp is a platform that provides children from vulnerable families with the opportunity to learn, grow, and connect with others in a safe and supportive environment.

## Scholarship Program

This project is a noble initiative dedicated to providing support to school children. It aims to enhance the lives of students by offering them the opportunity to pursue their education and by providing assistance to those in need of it. In Mongolia, our program supports children from vulnerable families who may not have access to the resources and support they need to continue their studies.

In 2022, we have provided scholarship and related support to 5 children where they were enabled to access quality education and opportunities.

Thanks to the ongoing scholarship of ESM, Mongen and Orgil schools that is enabling the students to succeed in their studies and achieve their goals.



## VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

We have established and continue to organize a volunteer program every week to support the activities of the kindergarten and the library. Our dedicated volunteers create various toys using non-allergenic and child-friendly materials, as well as provide guidance on how to encourage free thinking and creativity through drawing, painting, and crafting in simple and easy-to-understand ways. Our program also includes effective methods for cataloging library books and assisting in the preparation of courses materials.

Our volunteer program has been instrumental in providing valuable support to the community and promoting educational initiatives for children. We are committed to fostering a safe and inclusive learning environment that encourages active engagement and personal growth.

## FOOD DRIVE

During our annual food drive campaign where the Veloo Foundation distributes the necessary ingredients and fuel to the vulnerable families and elders of the Songinokhairkhan district and out in the countryside to help them celebrate the Tsagaan sar with the help of individual donors and corporate citizens.

In 2022, we were able to provide food hampers with the support of American School of Ulaanbaatar, Barloworld Mongolia, Corner Stone church of all Nations our expat donors to a total of 120 disadvantaged families near the Ulaanchuluut area of the Songinokhairkhan district.



## Community Outreach Initiatives

### WINTER WARMTH JACKET DRIVE



To keep warm the children in the community and in the countryside whose parents cannot afford winter clothes due to little or no income from the harsh coldness in the winter, we delivered 178 warm and versatile mongolian deel style jackets to children from the kindergartens, 124th school, 158th kindergarten, 'Unur Bul' foster care center and the reindeer herder families in the countryside of Taiga in 2022.

### MAKING CHRISTMAS SPECIAL WITH WARM GIFT

Every year, we make extra effort to make the Christmas celebration special for our community children through giving meaningful gifts. This year, we have made Christmas extra special for 300 children by providing thoughtfully prepared gifts from Gandys Foundation, British School of Ulaanbaatar and generous individuals.



### CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION

On the 1st day of June, 2022, with the generous donation from Rio Tinto Mongolia, the library and the kindergarten celebrated international children's day with a fun-fair themed celebration filled with games and sweets making the day extra special for 200 children in need.

## Employment and Vocational Training

### FRAN LONDON FABRIC ART CENTER

The employment initiative comprises direct employment and professional training and seminars at our projects of the Children of the Peak kindergarten, Gandys Community Library, Fran London Fabric arts center, and Soaring Crane Summer Camp.

Our staff at the Children of the Peak Sanctuary projects often get professional development seminars and as part of this a series of seminars on “Corporate Relations and Personal Development” in partnership with the Asian Development Bank and oral health seminars by the Misheel Kids Foundation were held.

The Fran London Fabric Arts Center, which was established with the aim of providing employment opportunities to women from difficult backgrounds. One of our biggest success was one of the seamstresses employed at the fabric art center started her own business and transitioning to entrepreneurship.

The fabric art center has been successful in fulfilling orders for both domestic and international markets, contributing towards reducing the country’s reliance on imports and increasing exports.

Moreover, the factory has taken a noble initiative to support vulnerable children by donating a portion of its profits towards providing clothes for them. As a part of this initiative, the factory has already donated 500 sets of clothing to children from needy families. For the sustainable operation of the sewing center and to strengthen our very own “Tuschkhan” brand, we always try to create new products with innovative ideas and as part of this, we made buffs (head and neck accessory) made with Mongolian cashmere wool in 2022.



## COMMUNITY GREENHOUSE

To empower and inspire the community members about affordable greenhouse solution and nutritious food ingredients, the COMMUNITY GREEN HOUSES were built on the Children of the Peak Sanctuary project land with the help of our volunteers where community members had hands-on experience of building, planting and growing vegetables.

As a result, the community members harvested vegetables, including zucchini, cucumber, tomato, carrot, onion and potato as well as some fruits like wild strawberries.

Special thanks to Rio Tinto, the teachers and the students of the American School of Ulaanbaatar for tutoring through the process.



## THE CASA HERBALIFE PROGRAM

The Casa Herbalife program, in collaboration with Herbalife Nutrition Foundation, is being implemented to combat malnutrition and provide healthy nutritious food to young children. To ensure the successful implementation of the program, a series of preparation work has been done which includes, installing kitchen appliances which were needed in the kindergarten and training the kindergarten cooks, giving workshops to both the kindergarten children and the children who come to the library about nutrition and consumption by doctors who specialize in this area.

The project was implemented throughout the year of 2022 and benefitted more than 400 children and 100 adults through the daily nutritious food, workshops, greenhouse and food supplies.

## PROVIDED DENTAL TREATMENT FOR 90 CHILDREN

We implement activities that support the health and wellbeing of our community children apart from the education initiatives to let them be healthy and well fed with nutritious food which support their learning performance. As part of this, 90 children in our kindergarten who had dental problems received dental screening and treatment by our longtime partner Misheel Kids Foundation.

Moreover, in collaboration with Bayanbiger Family Group Practice, a total of 50 children with the consent of their parents were conducted basic health test. Of the 50 children tested, 4 had urinalysis changes and reported to their parents.



### THE BLUE WOLF TOTEM EXPEDITION



2022 marks Veloo Foundation's very first, record setting longest endurance charity horseback ride on the planet, the Blue Wolf Totem Expedition with cooperation with the Horse Trek Mongolia. Started at the beginning of May and ended in late July, 2022, weathering constant challenges of dynamic weather in Mongolia, 19 intrepid riders successfully completed 3,640 kms

within 86 days on horseback from the East Gobi Desert all the way across Mongolia to finish at the most beautiful of all spots Tavan Bogd.

The good that this ride has undertaken will continue for a long time and the changes in the lives of our intrepid expeditionists are real and who knows where that will all lead.

We were able to celebrate the success of this record setting ride together at the beautiful Choijin Lama Monastery in Ulaanbaatar.

### GOBI GALLOP WILD KHERLEN RIVER RIDE 2022

Keeping our tradition for the 9th year in a row for the children, we organized our epic 700 kilometers adventure on the horseback again, the Gobi Gallop wild Kherlen river ride in September, 2022, 3 months later we successfully undertook the legendary Blue Wolf Totem Expedition.

### THE GOBI GALLOP GALA 2022 "SEAS THE DAY"



In celebration of our annual charity horseback ride and to congratulate our intrepid Gobi Gallopers, we hosted an event under the theme of Seas the Day. This event was not only keeping our tradition of the Gobi Gallop Gala but also making sure that our donors get to know that they are part of the bigger picture of helping us make a difference in the lives of the children.

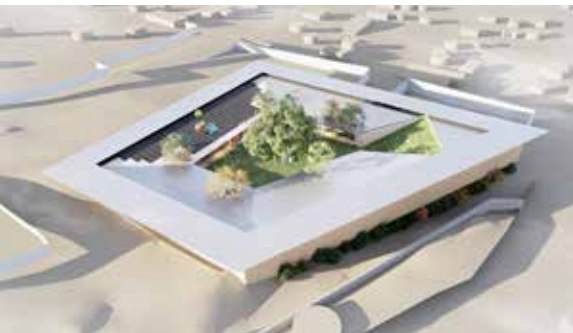
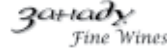
